

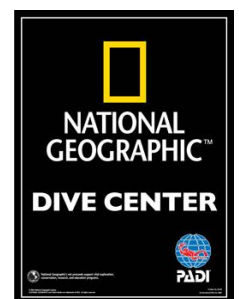


Divemaster



Dive N' Surf's PADI Divemaster Program is one of the most thorough and professional programs available. The course builds important diving skills used by anyone wishing to lead and/or supervise divers and students in training. The PADI Divemaster course is the cornerstone of PADI's leadership level programs and is a prerequisite for PADI Assistant Instructor and Open Water Instructor ratings.

Dive N' Surf's program consists of Academic; Confined Water, and Open Water Sessions as well as Internship Components. After completion of the program, a diver will have achieved a high level of personal diving skill, instructor-level knowledge of diving theory, significant training in instructor assistance during training activities, and will be able to assume a role of responsibility for the welfare of other divers in his/her charge.



Divemaster Course

- Class and Pool Sessions
- Up to four days at the ocean depending on class size.

Required Courses / Materials:

- Deep Diver Specialty
- Search & Recovery Specialty
- Compass, Timing Device, Dive Knife, Slate, Whistle, and Dive Float system w/ two anchors.

Prerequisite for Course:

- Certified within the last two years in First Aid and CPR.
- Certified PADI Advanced Open Water Diver or equivalent rating
- Certified Rescue Diver or equivalent rating
- Obtain valid CPR Training current for duration of course
- Obtain completed Medical Form valid for duration of course
 - *Mandatory before any in water training occurs*
- Supply all Scuba Equipment required for the course
- Be at least 18 years of age
- Completed 40 logged dives
- 60 logged dives must be obtained before certification may be issued
- DAN O2 Oxygen Administration

Required Gear:

- For class pool sessions and dives, you must supply a Total Scuba Diving System including: BCD, Regulator, Alternate Air Source, Dive Computer or Submersible Pressure Gauge.
