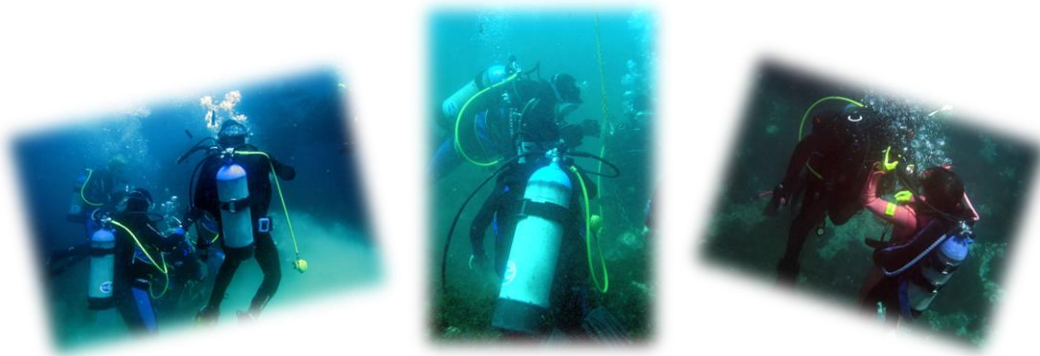




Scuba Camp

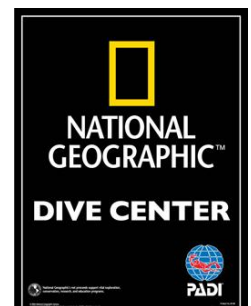

Dive Package: include in course fee.

- Avalon, Catalina 2-Day: (Includes; air fills, Ferry, and baggage transport)

WHAT WILL I NEED? An important part of our staff's job is to help you select your diving equipment. Many divers wish to learn in their own "Total Diving Systems" while an instructor is nearby to assist them with their gear. Our staff will be able to assist you in purchasing equipment suited to your individual needs. Open Water Scuba Diver Students are required to purchase the following pieces of dive equipment before the first class:

- Dive Mask—Your eye to the Underwater World
- Snorkel—Surface air supply
- Fins with heel strap—Provides underwater propulsion
- Neoprene Booties—Protects feet and provides warmth
- Neoprene Gloves—Protects hands and provides warmth
- Equipment Bag—Ensures you and your equipment arrive to the dive site together

My two sons and a family friend were just certified as PADI Open Water Divers through a one week (five weekdays) Scuba Camp run by Dive N' Surf in Redondo Beach. There were also five other students enrolled.

This was a fantastic opportunity for teens ONLY (ages 12-18) to become certified in only five days...which is very fast! Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday they trained in the pool and classroom at Dive N' Surf, from approximately 9am to 5pm. Wednesday and Friday they all boarded the Catalina Express in San Pedro for a day trip to Avalon, which included two certification dives each day.

The instructors, David Jensen – Director of Scuba Operations at Dive N' Surf and Justin Diedolf were wonderful with the kids. They all had a great time and it was a wonderful learning experience. All eight of them are now PADI certified scuba divers. I think it is great that Dive N' Surf has a camp like this for teenagers to get PADI certified. It is usually a hassle to get kids certified, but this was simple and FUN for them. What a GREAT summertime activity!
